ADVISORY INFORMATION

IMPORTANT: When applying this product under the terms of this Extension of authorisation, comply with any resistance guidance or restrictions stated on the product label.

Total reliance on one pesticide will hasten the development of resistance. Pesticides of different chemical types or alternative control measures should be included in the planned programme. Alternating with different modes of action is a recognised anti-resistance strategy.

To avoid resistance do not apply repeated applications of any DMI fungicide alone on the same crop against the same disease. In such situation use an appropriate tank mixture or alternate with another fungicide with a different mode of action. Where resistance occurs TOLEDO may not give adequate disease control. Consult the latest advice from FRAG UK and FRAC regarding disease resistance strategies.

This Extension of authorisation relates to the use of 'Toledo' (M18298) on outdoor and protected crops of blackberry, loganberry, rubus hybrid, raspberry for the control of . cane blight (*Leptosphaeria coniothyrium*), powdery mildew (*Podosphaera aphanis var. aphanis*) and cane botrytis (*Botrytis cinerea*).

The product must only be applied once in any given year; either at a maximum indiviidual dose of 0.25 l product / ha between when shoots are about 90% of final length (BBCH 40) and before the end of flowering all petals fallen (BBCH 70) or after harvest of the final crop (BBCH 89).

A single application only may be applied in any given year, via either a broadcast air-assisted sprayer, a hand held (knapsack) sprayer with hydraulic nozzles or hand-held tank and lance sprayer in 1000 I water / ha.

APPENDIX 1: CONDITIONS OF EXTENSION OF AUTHORISATION

The conditions below are obligatory. They must be complied with when the Extension of authorisation occurs. Failure to comply with the following conditions will result in the withdrawal or amendment of the Extension of authorisation under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 and may result in other enforcement action, including prosecution. For the purposes of this Extension of authorisation only, the conditions and/or requirements shown below supersede any corresponding conditions and/or requirements set out on the label or otherwise provided for under the product authorisation which would otherwise apply.

Operator Protection:

- (1) Broadcast air-assisted sprayers must only be used where the operator's normal working position is within a closed cab with a suitable in-cab filtration system* during application in protected situations. *Closed cabin meeting at least EN 15695 category 3.
- (2) Vehicle-mounted or trailed horizontal or vertical boom sprayers must only be used where the operator's normal working position is within a closed cab with a suitable in-cab filtration system* or suitable respiratory protective equipment** must be

worn during application in protected situations. *Closed cabin meeting at least EN 15695 category 3. **Disposable filtering facepiece respirator to at least EN149 FFP3 or equivalent.

- (3) Other engineering control of operator exposure must be used where reasonably practicable in addition to the following personal protective equipment:
 - (a) Operators must wear suitable protective clothing (coveralls) and suitable protective gloves when handling the concentrate or applying by hand-held equipment.
 - (b) Operators must wear suitable protective gloves when applying by vehicle-mounted or trailed equipment outdoors.
 - (c) Operators must wear suitable protective clothing (coveralls) and suitable protective gloves when applying using pedestriancontrolled sprayer with vertical boom or where contact with treated foliage is unavoidable during application in protected situations.
 - (d) Workers must wear suitable protective clothing in which arms, body and legs are fully covered when re-entering treated areas or handling treated crops or contaminated surfaces within 6 weeks of treatment in protected situations. (See 'Other Specific Restrictions').
- (4) However, engineering controls in addition to those specified in (1) and (2) above may replace personal protective equipment if a COSHH assessment shows that they provide an equal or higher standard of protection.

Environmental protection:

(1) Since there is a risk to aquatic life from use, users not applying the statutory buffer zone must either themselves carry out, or ensure that someone else has carried out a Local Environment Risk Assessment for Pesticides (LERAP) on their behalf before each spraying operation from a broadcast air-assisted sprayer. Users must not allow direct spray from such sprayers to fall within 5m of the top of the bank of any static or flowing waterbody or within 5m of a ditch which is dry at the time of application (these distances to be measured as set out in the booklet 'Local Environment Risk Assessment for

Pesticides - Broadcast Air-assisted Sprayers' - and any amendments that are made to it) unless:

- (a) The LERAP indicates that a narrower buffer zone will be sufficient; and
- (b) Any measures indicated by the LERAP as justifying the narrower buffer zone are complied with in full and in accordance with any conditions applicable to them.

Spray must be aimed away from water.

- (2) The results of the LERAP must be recorded in written form and must be available for a period of three years for inspection to any person entitled to exercise enforcement powers under or in connection with the Plant Protection Products Regulations 2011 or the Plant Protection Products (Sustainable Use) Regulations 2012. (An electronic record will satisfy the requirement for a written record, providing it is similarly available for inspection and can be copied).
- (3) Detailed guidance on LERAPs and how to conduct a LERAP are contained in the booklet 'Local Environment Risk Assessment for Pesticides Broadcast Air-assisted Sprayers' (Ref: PB6533), available from HSE Chemicals Regulation Division's website. All LERAPs must be carried out in accordance with this Guidance and any amendments that are made to it.

Other specific restrictions:

- (1) This product must only be applied in accordance with the terms of this extension of authorisation, the product label and/or leaflet and any additional guidance on extensions of authorisation.
- (2) This product qualifies for inclusion within the Local Environment Risk Assessment for Pesticides (LERAP) scheme for broadcast air-assisted sprayers. Before each spraying operation from a broadcast air-assisted sprayer, either a LERAP must be carried out in accordance with the 'Local Environment Risk Assessment for Pesticides Broadcast Air-Assisted Sprayers' booklet available from the HSE Chemicals Regulation Division's website or the statutory buffer zone must be maintained. The results of the LERAP must be recorded and kept available for three years.

- (3) The product must only be applied once in any given year; either between when shoots are about 90% of final length (BBCH 40) and before the end of flowering all petals fallen (BBCH 70) or after harvest of the final crop (BBCH 89).
- (4) A minimum interval of 14 days between application and harvest must be observed.
- (5) Managers must carry out a thermal comfort checklist (see -

http://www.hse.gov.uk/temperature/assets/docs/ther mal-comfort-checklist.pdf) prior to worker re-entry tasks. If needed, an additional heat stress check list and associated risk assessment must be undertaken (see-

http://www.hse.gov.uk/temperature/assets/docs/heat-stress-checklist.pdf) and the records retained. Temperature and humidity inside tunnels/glasshouses should be monitored during reentry tasks. If conditions become such that there is a risk of heat related illness, or workers complain of ill effects, then work must cease until the risk is reduced. It is not acceptable for workers to remove clothing and continue working.

APPENDIX 2: GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR AN EXTENSION OF AUTHORISATION

Failure to comply with the following conditions will result in the withdrawal or amendment of the Extension of authorisation under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 and may result in other enforcement action, including prosecution.

Adverse effects:

The authorisation holder must immediately notify the Secretary of State, the Welsh Ministers, the Scottish Ministers and the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland (care of the Health and Safety Executive), if they have any new information on the potentially adverse effects of the authorised product, or of residues of an active substance in that product when used in accordance with the conditions of this authorisation. For those products authorised under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 as it has effect by virtue of the Protocol on Ireland/Northern Ireland in the EU withdrawal agreement, authorisation holders must also tell the other relevant competent authorities of the EC Member States (a list of which is available from the Health and Safety Executive) and the EC Commission. Failure to comply with this requirement is an offence.

Provision of information:

The authorisation holder must comply with all requests for information required by, or on behalf of, the Secretary of State, the Welsh Ministers, the Scottish Ministers or the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009.
