Background and project objectives

Root rot in container-grown Choisya is a continuing problem of unknown cause. A range of fungi have been isolated from affected plants. This project will utilise a survey of major UK producers of Choisya, plant clinic records and literature sources to determine the situations in which root rotting has occurred and any pathogens or other factors involved in losses. This will be in order to formulate potential control options for testing in future work.
